

# The Stops of a Pastor and Church

## Part One

Be a leader and visionary for the church where God has you to serve and don't feel guilty or fearful about stopping things that just aren't working for the ministry today. ### Stop trying to do everything yourself.

**Exodus 18:17-18** “And Moses' father in law said unto him, The thing that thou doest *is* not good. Thou wilt surely wear away, both thou, and this people that *is* with thee: for this thing *is* too heavy for thee; thou art not able to perform it thyself alone.”

A pastor will need to learn delegation and “stop” trying to do everything himself, if the church is to move forward. A one man operation can only do so much in the ministry and a church will be hindered and eventually hurt if that one man leaves or dies. We have seen many churches run by one man and then didn't know what to do after he was gone.

Many pastors are perfectionists with a touch of OCD that tends to make them overly controlling or micromanagers (been there/done that). Some rather do things themselves rather than let others try and not do what they would have done, or as good as they would have done it.

May I say this about small churches and by-vocational pastors, having very few to whom to look at getting things done in the church. I have been working with small churches for decades and been by-vocational for many of these years and in these churches. You may have to do many things in the church yourself at the beginning until God gives you more people to use and work in the church. But this should not continue for the life of the ministry as you are there. If you don't let others take responsibility and do things in the church they will always depend on you to do everything. Even in smaller churches the members should take on some type of responsibilities so that the pastor is not giving his time to the menial task of keeping everything going in the church.

Let's get back to some of the most important duties of the pastor which is prayer, studying, preaching, visiting and caring for the flock. Some pastors think that if they don't do it, it won't get done and maybe that's true, but we need to try and train and let others do the things that they can in the ministry and for the church. A pastor should not have to make sure that he gets to the church first to make sure that the temperature is set for the service and the doors unlocked for the members and visitors, and then make sure all is off and locked before he leaves. Some pastors spend hours mowing the grass and cleaning the church buildings while their members waste their time doing nothing. Some members are willing to let the pastor do everything if he doesn't ask them - (“ye have not because ye ask not”).

There are many things that I could mention but I think you get the idea that as a pastor and servant leader we should be willing to do anything, but also willing to train others to do what they can in the church. Learn to stop trying to do everything and become skilled at delegating the non essentials so you and the church can move forward together. It may surprise you that there are some members that would be glad to do something in the church to relieve you, so that you can do the main thing that God has called you to do for the church.

This is not an easy lesson to learn for the pastor or the members, but necessary for the health and growth of the church. May the Lord help you to have the willing help from the members that will encourage you as well as be a challenge to them. God bless and let someone else do it \_\_\_\_.

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## Part Three

**Let us stop a superior attitude which comes from pride and divides the brethren.**

**2 Cor. 6:17-18** Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean *thing*; and I will receive you, And will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty.

**Romans 14:1-3** Him that is weak in the faith receive ye, *but* not to doubtful disputations. For one believeth that he may eat all things: another, who is weak, eateth herbs. Let not him that eateth despise him that eateth not; and let not him which eateth not judge him that eateth: for God hath received him.

I know that separation is a hot topic in many groups (camps) of Independent Baptist, but there needs to be a balanced view on this debate among the brethren. I'm not trying to say what is right or wrong for individuals, churches or colleges. But the Bible is clear about the sin of pride, haughtiness and arrogance in our lives, our churches and schools which hinders God's grace to us. **James 4:6** But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble.

The Lord stands and opposes all pride no matter what form it may take in our personal and church life. It may have been R.A. Torrey that said "a church can be a straight as a gun barrel and just as empty" and in many of our churches that is the case today. Many have been so separated that they have become isolated from everyone else that aren't in perfect line with their ideas of personal preferences in certain standards. This forms what I would call "Super-Separatist Ideology" which has been given to some by a few prominent preachers, churches or colleges of the past or maybe also present, which has given their personal standard for everyone else to follow.

A "super-separatist ideology" that forms clicks and camps with pastors and churches have been the downfall of many good pastors, families, churches, schools and colleges. It has caused untold problems and hurt in relationships that only needed more love, forgiveness and understanding from each other. A super-separatist attitude has hurt the missionaries who have been serving for decades and those who are now trying to raise support today for their mission field. There is a balanced view of separation from the scriptures that leads to a holy life of the believer, with a heart of humility and love for others. There is going to be a whole lot of surprises in heaven of what we thought were a strong stand in separation and personal standards that was really our own personal preferences.

Sure the Bible does call us to be separate from certain things and people, but it's not saying to cut off and isolate ourselves from everyone that has just a little different point of view on nonessentials of which is not "true" Biblical doctrine. Even in our separation we are to show love, respect, and compassion with a heart of humility for the Lord and others. We need to learn how to be truly separate from sin and sinful practices but accepting and loving the sinner whom the Lord gave His life so that they may be saved. May we lay aside this "super-separatist" attitude that causes us to be lifted up with pride, which may be the down fall of many churches.

By the way I do practice Biblical separation, but just can't seem to please everyone's personal preferences. We try not to be a stumbling block to others and show them Biblical love any way.

### **Let's stop Pulpit Plagiarism that contributes to church Paralyzation. (2Tim.2:15)**

I really want to be a help to pastors and churches here with a subject that can be really sensitive to those whom it may affect and may even offend some, but that is not my intention. Most everyone knows, even the secular world that plagiarism is wrong, but with the men of God that preach to God's people it should be very much *guarded against*. For those who may be plagiarizing ignorantly, may this be a help in understanding what they are doing and how to correct it. For those who are doing it knowingly, may the Holy Spirit use this to convict and bring a repentant heart to confess what they're doing and correct this dependency. This practice not only grieves the heart of God, but is not healthy for the church or the pastor.

**Pla'gia-rize** - To steal or purloin from the writings of another; to appropriate without due acknowledgment (the ideas or expressions of another).

In the current access of so much material online, pastors are subject to getting into a bad habit of just copying sermons and preaching them as their own without due acknowledgement from the original author. In the proper use of other sermons for getting insight and help to inspire one's sermon is one thing, but to get all your sermons (series) and preach them as your own that is plagiarism and that's a sin. As with anything there should be balance, therefore a pastor should inform himself of what is and is not plagiarism.

Some churches are in "paralyzation" which means that they are not going anywhere in their ministries and almost no spiritual growth of the members. The Holy Spirit will not bless lying, deception, manipulation and stealing which is plagiarism and plagiarizing is causing churches to be destroyed or be rendered ineffective. Without the power and energy of the Holy Spirit in our churches we are in a paralyzed mode, doing everything in the flesh.

**Par'a-ly-za'tion** - The act or process of paralyzing, or the state of being paralyzed.

**Par'a-lyze** - Fig.: To unnerve; to destroy or impair the energy of; to render ineffective;

If God has called a man to preach, then He has called him to take time to study and this is something that every pastor will have to decide for himself with the Lord. Many pastors are by-vocational and are strapped for time to study but God can help you set some priorities and be balanced in sermon preparation. For the fulltime pastor it may be managing your time and priorities in a way that a good portion of time is for sermon preparation. For the multi-staff pastor there should be no excuse, maybe a total rearranging of everyone on staff is needed to make sure that the pastor has his quality time to study. Studying is not online sermon searching.

If one is caught up in plagiarism as a continual way of getting all his sermons, just know that the Lord wants to use you and would rather you look to Him for His message each week to preach to His people. Maybe one should read more on sermon structure, (homiletics), priorities and time management. May the Lord use this to challenge and encourage pastors to use what God gave them to serve His church and not solely depend on another preachers sermons.

**Psalms 63:11** "the mouth of them that speak lies shall be stopped."

**Proverbs 30:8** Remove far from me vanity and lies: give me neither poverty nor riches; feed me with food convenient for me:

Satan is all about lying and he doesn't care what lie is told, to whom it is told or where it is told, just so long that someone listens and believes him. There are literally thousands of lies bombarding us each day in our thoughts, coming from the world and the flesh which satan uses to instigate and insinuate into our lives daily. This is why we are to put on the whole armor of God daily starting with the girdle of truth and renounce all the lies of the enemy for that day. Here are some lies that he gives to pastors and churches;

- Why keep doing all of this if there's no fruit – truth is its God's work and the results are His if we are doing our part. (Gal.6:9 / 1Peter2:15)
- Our church is getting to liberal or is staying to legalistic – truth is there are all kinds of stages of maturity from which each one sees things in a different light as they grow in Christ. (2Peter3:18 / Rom.14) Note please let the Bible be our guide and not our pet peas.
- Our church is not as loving as it should – truth is that each church is as loving as they want to be and can increase in their love for the Lord and each other. (Eph.4:16 / 1Thes.3:12)
- I could be a better pastor if I were in a different church – truth is God can help you be the best pastor where you're at if it's His will for you to be there. (Jer.3:15 / Eph.11)
- My ministry and family life is conflicting and I can't seem to please both – truth is you don't have to choose it's already been chosen for you. (Eph.5:21-33 / 1Tim.3:1-7) Note as one puts God first (Matt.5:33) everything and everyone will be put into proper place in our lives.
- I have so much to do but I can't meet everyone demands or expectations – truth is that we are accountable unto God first and He doesn't put more upon us than we can handle. (Pro.3:5-6) Sometimes we ourselves and others put unrealistic expectations upon ourselves.
- No one cares or understands how I feel – truth is Jesus knows, cares and understands how we are feeling. (Heb.4:15 / 1Peter5:7 / Phil.4:6-7) By the way others do care, we care!
- I'm afraid of falling and failing in the ministry and everyone will forsake me – truth is no one is perfect and everyone makes mistakes, but God will not forsake you and really true Christian friends won't either. (Heb.10:5 / Pro.17:17 / Pro.18:24)

Many times pastors and church members are being misled by satan's lies about each other in which he tries to cause conflict and mistrust. Just don't believe everything that comes into your mind as truth, test it against God's word and true facts. Remember to put on the whole armor of God each day and stand against the lie's of satan, the world and the flesh. May the Lord bless you and that's the truth!

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
